Living Well with Chronic Conditions

The Northland Living Well Collaborative offers free classes throughout the year to help you manage your health condition and live well. Materials are included and classes are free!

EVIDENCE-BASED CHRONIC DISEASE SELF-MANAGEMENT PROGRAMS

The Chronic Disease Self-Management Education programs will assist older adults to better manage their chronic condition, improve their quality of life and lower health care costs. During the six-week classes, participants make weekly action plans, share experiences and help each other solve problems they encounter in creating and carrying out their self-management program.

- Chronic Disease Self-Management
- Chronic Pain Self-Management
- Diabetes Self-Management

EVIDENCE-BASED FALL PREVENTION PROGRAMS

A Matter of Balance - This program is designed to reduce the fear of falling, diminish the risk of falling and improve activity levels. Class meets once or twice weekly for eight sessions.

Walk with Ease - Participants meet three times weekly for six weeks to build confidence in order to be physically active. Includes exercises, personalized walking routines and a free walking guidebook.

Tai Chi for Arthritis and Falls Prevention - A safe way to relieve arthritis pain and gain balance, strength and flexibility. Tai chi can be done both seated and standing. Classes meet twice weekly for 45 - 60 minutes.

Transportation Services

Even if you still drive, you are eligible for this service. Why worry about traffic, directions, parking and weather conditions?

Rides must be scheduled no later than 2:00 p.m. the day before ride is needed. A 50-mile limit per 1-way ride will apply. A companion can always ride for FREE.

Medical, Grocery and Essential Business

Limit of four round-trip rides per month. Twelve round-trip rides for Dialysis, Chemotherapy, Radiation, Physical or Cardiac Therapies. Clients may use their allotted rides to see hospitalized immediate family members.

COVID-19, Influenza and Other Vaccines

Transportation for COVID-19, influenza and other vaccines at no cost to Platte County older adults 60 and over. This program will not affect any other transportation guidelines, limits or requirements.

Residents of communities with transportation service are not eligible to utilize our transportation service.

In-Home Services

Cost sharing is income based. Income guidelines can be found online at www.platteseniors.org. Caregivers may not transport seniors.

PERSONAL CARE

Assistance with bathing, toileting, shampooing, dressing, meal preparation and other personal care services are performed by a certified nurse's aid, home health or personal care assistant.

HOMEMAKER CARE

Light housekeeping, laundry and similar services.

RESPIRE CARE

Could you use a break? Respite care provides short-term breaks that can relieve stress, restore energy and promote balance for family caregivers. Must be providing 24/7 care.



Platte County Senior Fund Community Partners



CAPABLE is a five-month program that provides one-on-one care in your home. A registered nurse, occupational therapist and home safety modification technician make up this in-home support team. This program is a partnership between NKC Health, Clay County Senior Services, Platte County Senior Fund and Rebuilding Together Kansas City.

Project Lifesaver

Project Lifesaver provides emergency response agencies with the ability to track and locate individuals who wander. The participant wears a small transmitter around their wrist or ankle that emits a tracking signal. Search and rescue teams use locator tracking systems to find the missing person. PCSF finances 100% of the cost of this program to ensure anyone needing the service receives it.
