| \$ | 3,408 ~ \$ | 4,684 | = 50% copay |
| \$ | 4,685 ~ \$ | 5,962 | = 75% copay |
| \$ | 5,963 & | above | = Private Pay Referral |

Co-pay benefits are determined by the average monthly income received from:

- Social Security
- Pension
- Rental Property
- Taxable Interest
- Dividend Earnings
- Wages

Based on 125% of 2024 federal poverty rates: single = \$15,060/yr; couple = \$20,440/yr as issued by the Department of Health and Human Services.
