

2023 INCOME GUIDELINES MEANS SAVING FOR SENIORS





You may be able to lower your co-pay for income based services, such as in-home services, minor home repairs, household systems and accessibility safety modifications.

The PCSF Board of Directors established new income guidelines to reflect current poverty statistics.

Co-pay benefits are determined by the average monthly income received from:

- Social Security
- Pension

PLATTE

- Rental Property
- Taxable Interest
- Dividend Earnings

Please review these new guidelines. If your co-pay falls in a new category you may:

- Call to schedule a reassessment
- Mail copies of all income documents



If your co-pay level does change, you and your provider will be given notice of the new level and effective date for the change.

Accessibility Modifications

Approved modifications include durable medical equipment for fall prevention, wheelchair ramps, stair lifts and tub-cut-outs. annual household allotment is \$2,000 income-based co-pay applies.



Household Systems

Heating, air conditioning and water heater repair or replacement provided by qualified technicians. Client must own the home. Limited funding available. annual household allotment is \$2,000.00 incomebased co-pay applies.



Minor Home Repair

Minor plumbing and electrical concerns, carpentry, necessary painting after repair, gutter guards, gutter cleaning one time yearly, glass/screen replacement, caulking, stair repair, lock repair, fence repair, weatherization, appliance repair, etc. No cosmetic painting, TV repair or trash compactor repairs. annual household allotment is \$2,000.00 income-based co-pay applies



Personal Safety Monitoring

Personal Safety Monitoring products enable you to summon help when needed. They provide confidence when living independently. *Fall detection is available with all models upon customer request.* To find out about our PSM program please call the office to review your options.



Transportation for COVID-19 and Influenza Vaccines

Older adults 60 and over that reside in Platte County can call for **FREE** transportation to and from the vaccination site. Even if you still drive, you are eligible for this service. Why worry about traffic, directions, parking and weather conditions?

This service is only FREE for the COVID -19, and Influenza vaccines.

Residents of communities with transportation service are not eligible to utilize our transportation service.

Rides must be scheduled no later than 2:00 p.m. the day before ride is needed. A 50-mile limit per 1-way ride will apply. A companion can always ride for FREE.

**FREE transportation to COVID-19 and Influenza vaccines will not affect any other transportation guidelines, limits or requirements.
