

## PCSF Income Guidelines - effective 1/1/22

### Single Households

- \$ - ~ \$ 1,342 = 0% copay
- \$ 1,343 ~ \$ 2,061 = 25% copay
- \$ 2,062 ~ \$ 2,780 = 50% copay
- \$ 2,781 ~ \$ 3,499 = 75% copay
- \$ 3,500 & above = Private Pay Referral

### Couples

- \$ - ~ \$ 1,815 = 0% copay
- \$ 1,816 ~ \$ 2,788 = 25% copay
- \$ 2,789 ~ \$ 3,761 = 50% copay
- \$ 3,762 ~ \$ 4,735 = 75% copay
- \$ 4,736 & above = Private Pay Referral

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Co-pay benefits are determined by the average monthly income received from:

- Social Security
- Pension
- Rental Property
- Taxable Interest
- Dividend Earnings
- Wages

Based on 125% of 2021 federal poverty rates: single = \$12,880; couple = \$17,420 as issued by Department of Health and Human Services.
